03/03/2015 Catching Your Balance

"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You give a tenth of your spices ---- mint, dill and cummin. But you have neglected the more important matters of the law ---- justice, mercy, and faithfulness. You should have practiced the latter without neglecting the former" (Matt.23:23).

Have you ever watched a girl do an exercise in gymnastics on the balance beam? The girl must do some intricate maneuvers on a beam that is just 10 centimeters (4 inches) wide. While doing these maneuvers, she must maintain her balance on the beam. Losing one's balance by either tottering on the beam or falling off, is a severe deduction in points. Here's the science behind how one remains balanced or stable. "An object will remain stable (balanced) if a vertical line from its center of gravity falls within its base" Did you get that? If that line falls outside of the base, the object will topple over. The Pharisees and Scribes mentioned in today's verse were

unstable and therefore, out of balance... They got the giving part (mint,dill, cummin) but did balance it with the more important matters (justice, mercy, faithfulness)... That thing in life that we call balance is one of the most difficult things to achieve. It is so difficult because it entails working on our whole character. There are so many issues involved in being a Christian, and to be a good one we must strive in developing a well-rounded character. The Scribes and Pharisees went wrong in not balancing the "doing" with the "caring..." They always toppled over... Jesus calls us to be balanced in all the important aspects of our lives... Our character must be in harmony with our conduct. If we do not grasp the concept of balancing all the important parts of our lives, we'll fall off the beam every time... More on this tomorrow

"Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and His worshipers must worship Him in spirit and in truth" (Jn.4:24).

We have all seen and read today's verses. I will take a bit of a different view of them today.. The world puts so much emphasis on the external, that it is driven by it. Just look at the commercials on TV. Almost all the products they shill are about external things like the right car, clothes, cleaning products and foods. One of the ways that we sometimes get unbalanced is when we put too much credibility on actions. When we do this, we run the risk of neglecting to work on the inner spirit that ought to motivate those actions... Perhaps the reason this happens is that the external things are easier to get at and get right. The scriptures teach this: What God wants, primarily, is our heart. If our inner character is not lined up with His character, then our outward actions can be almost meaningless. Today's verses tell us that without question, the truth of our actions is important --- but so is the spirit... Pondering this, as the Lord's people, lets be sure to work on actually being more balanced. We should not view our lives as a 'high wire act..."

Tomorrow we'll look at our responsibilities from a slightly different viewpoint, so we can have a more balanced understanding...

03/05/2015 Its About Who We Are "Why you call me Lord, Lord, and do not do what I say?" "But the one who hears my words and does not put them into practice is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation. The moment the torrent struck that house, it collapsed and its destruction was complete" (Lk.6: 46; 49).

In the Book of Acts, the apostle Paul appears before King Agrippa and tells him about Jesus. His reply is informative to us... "Do you think in such a short time you can persuade me to become a Christian..." (26:28). By this time in Paul's ministry, one of the titles that believers wore and still wear today is Christian... The call to be a Christian is just what the the name implies... We must make it our aim to be Christ-like..... Another term that the Bible attaches to His people is the call to be a disciple... The word disciple lets us know that goal must be to follow and learn from Jesus. When we do this, we can truly be Jesus' disciples. Another word applied to Jesus' followers is saint. A Roman centurion came to Jesus on behalf of his servant who was paralyzed and suffering. He realized Jesus' power and related it to his, as we see in today's verse. The Roman army became so strong because of their almost fanatical respect for authority. Literally everything within the Roman culture worked within the framework of those who gave and received orders. The empire flourished when respect for authority was a part of their fiber. It worked the same way with Israel. They got in trouble as a nation when "everyone did what was right in his own eyes..." (Judges 21:25). When the subject is about values and morality, the lines of authority often become blurred. For a Christian, God is the ultimate source through which authority flows. Christian people do good because it is built within them to be like God... The actual use of the word good implies the very being of God. Nations fall because of a lack of authority. I would contend that without God to provide a moral compass through His authority, it is impossible to choose what is right and wrong. When people leave God out of the equation, the absolute worst behavior becomes acceptable. Because God found a residue of goodness within people, He

sent us a Savior... When we take away the authority that flows from God, the pattern of hope, reason and promise fade away. The lesson of the centurion is good...

03/13/2015 What, Me Worry?


"Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own" (Matt.6:34).


03/20/2015 And The Word Was God

You need to read Deuteronomy 18:9-13 to see what God thought about these detestable practices. We show residues of superstition today with the reading of horoscopes and the use of terms like "fate, karma, gesundheit, or knock on wood..." Fear of words lingers even among the scientifically sophisticated. Superstitions die hard.. The apostle John was drawing on the power of words when he began his gospel..."In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning." John goes all the way back to Genesis 1:1... "In the beginning..." For the ancients, and even us today, a word or a name was more than a convenient tag. A spoken word was and is a living symbol of a person, thing, concept or action. Here is the really neat part of Jn.1:1-2 and of my devotional this morning... John made a declaration that the Word (Jesus Christ) was unmistakably attached to the being of God, just as surely as your name identifies you... Jesus was the source of creation and the very essence of eternal power. When the name JESUS is spoken, it is synonymous with His authority. In the person of Jesus, the Word of God manifested itself in human form... That Word is the very grace, love and promise of God...

03/23/2015 Authority For God's People "The Lord commanded us to obey all these decrees and to FEAR the Lord our God, so that we might always prosper and be kept alive, as is the case today" (Deut.6:24).

There are three things that often go unappreciated in a world that is obsessed with individual rights and freedom of expression. They are: authority, obedience, discipline. Now don't get me wrong.... I am alright with individual rights and freedom of expression, but they must co-exist with the three things I just mentioned. In today's verse, Moses, who has been given the authority over the people, is reminding them about obeying the LAW that they had just received and their responsibility to it. In the world of human affairs, those in charge are often tainted by human imperfections; it is never this way in the kingdom of God! With God, we are not given any "arbitrary" laws to obey. The ruler of heaven and earth has no master blueprint to keep folks from having fun... Simply put, He knows the behaviors that hurt people, and He forbids them. In today's verse, Moses tells Israel, "so that we might always prosper..." As it comes from God, "thou shalt not" might actually mean "do yourself no harm..." Sometimes, people may feel deprived in the short term, but in the long-term, obedience to God results in blessed and noble lives. Christians ought not wait for heaven to enter the joys of godly living, but rather experience them now... Today's world offers sins which have a seasonal appeal that we must resist, just as Moses did. "He chose to be mistreated along with the people of God rather than enjoy the pleasures of sin for a short time" (Heb.11:25). Given the nature of the God we serve, the wise and the blessed obey Him....

The famous parable of the Prodigal Son is a heart-warming story about a young man who made some bad decisions, but also made a comeback. We all love comebacks...I won't go into the details of the parable except for the verses I have picked out today. To me, what is so telling about the parable involves the reality check... You and I can have these moments of clarity too. It is extremely difficult to do what is right if we don't see the truth about ourselves. There are times when all of us have allowed a bad decision affect our course of action, and that course may take us down a path we shouldn't be on. That's exactly what the Prodigal Son did... The part of today's verse that I underlined is a moment of clarity... A reality check... In sports, its often called a "gut-check." The young man changed his course of action for the better when his thinking about himself changed. It changed because he looked at who he really was. I believe that this sounds familiar to us because it has happened in our lives. "But when he came to his

senses...." That coming to his senses represented a truthful look at himself, and that look led to actions that were more beneficial. A more beneficial life is contingent upon looking at ourselves to see our value, and then to live accordingly. When we downgrade ourselves in our own thinking, we will live in a way that is consistent with that thinking. Lets have more moments of clarity and reality checks, so that we will live the life that the Lord wants us to. Its all about coming to our senses...

"He chose to give us birth through the word of truth, that we might be a kind of firstfruits of all he created" (Jas.1:18).

Have you ever seen people at an athletic contest waving around one of those silly Styrofoam mitts in the shape of a one (1)? They are obviously trying to let people know that their team is #1... God doesn't wave one of those around, but many times in scripture He lets us know that we are His #1 creation. As far as living things go, we are a kind of firstfruits of all He created... Our worth to God is inherent in just being who we are... "He chose us through birth through the word of truth... " We are His creatures. Having been created in His image, (Gen.1:27) we are each personal beings. Any way you slice it, personal beings are worth more than non-personal ones... We may have spent some time squandering the talents He blessed us with, but nonetheless, we have a value that is ours simply because we were created in His image. In part of The Sermon On The Mount, (Matt.6:25-34) Jesus lets us know that we're worth more than the other animals, so we must take a long hard look at ourselves in terms of what we are worth to the God who made us! When we fall short of God's expectations, we actually devalue not only ourselves but the one who made us in His own image. Now Here's the really cool part... "Be careful, however, that the exercise of your freedom does not become a stumbling block to the weak" (1 Cor.8:9).

The apostle Paul is dealing with a tricky issue here in this chapter of 1st Corinthians. It is whether or not it is okay to eat meat that has been sacrificed to idols. There is nothing inherently wrong with it as Paul explains in verse eight. Strong Christians can readily see this, but the ones with a weaker conscience don't get it. Paul lets us know that since Christ died for the weak as well as the strong, that the stronger ones must be a positive influence on the weaker ones. It is as if Paul is making this a kind of stewardship that a stronger Christian must assume. The actions of the strong, however innocent, may still serve as examples that may lead others from the faith... Negatively influencing a brother or sister in the Lord to violate one's conscience is equivalent to sinning against Jesus... "Therefore, if what I eat causes my brother to fall into sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I will not cause him to fall" (1 Cor.8:12). When we think only of ourselves, it may make us blind to the possible repercussions that stem from our actions... It is individualistic perspective that ignores the needs of others and Christ's great lesson about guiding others through love to salvation. Here in 1st Corinthians chapter eight, Paul reaffirms Christ's teachings, by reminding stronger Christians to act as stewards or mentors to the weak. Paul vowed, that even though his actions were innocent and acceptable, if they caused his weaker brother to stumble, he would not do them again. Jesus put it this way: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Lk.9:23). It may be a hard lesson to learn, but I think that the hard is what makes it great....

"Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds" (Heb.10:23-24).

The best influence we can exhibit is our positive example of Christian living, a commitment to the truth, and wisdom in congregational affairs. These all help in preparing someone else for stronger faith in Christ. Position within the church is less important than a commitment to its purpose in helping to guide and assist others to find fellowship in Christ. To abandon one's influence in strengthening the body is both foolish and selfish... There is a blessing for us when we consider ourselves as messengers for Christ...
